
Resources for Learning and Reading Online

Oxfordshire Public Libraries

The public library is richly equipped to support students with reading for pleasure and research. People can join Oxfordshire Libraries if they live, work or study in the area, so all St Greg's staff and students are eligible to join, and the service is free. To join, you will need to register online. Once joined, a pin will be sent to your email address, giving you instant access to online resources. Library cards are not being sent out at the moment, but once it is safe, they will be delivered to your home address.

<u>JSTOR</u> — We subscribe to JSTOR, which offers access to more than 12 million academic journal articles across all curriculum areas, suitable for A Level study. The amount of resources available has been expanded due to COVID19. Username: stgregorygcss Password: oxford



Open Access journal articles — Open Access articles are available to read for free, and can most easily be found through a search of the Directory for Open Access Journals. If you come across a paywalled article while researching that

you would like to read, use the <u>Open Access Button</u> to search for a free and legal copy online, or email the article author directly to request a copy — most academics are delighted to freely share their work when asked. Other similar resources are <u>Unpaywall, Open Textbooks</u>, <u>Core, Project Muse</u>, and the <u>Directory of Open Access Books</u>.

<u>Google Scholar</u> and <u>Google Books</u> — Many academic articles are available to search on Google Scholar, although the full text may not be linked — in these cases, try using the Open Access options above. Similarly, Google Books has a vast index of books, many of which are available to read in full, but some will only be available as samples or for limited access.
