Ramadan Mubarak! I had the great pleasure to represent Greyfriars at an event this week: an Iftar dinner at Mansfield College, hosted by the [Dialogue Society](#). This was a time to come together as a community – in many aspects a multi-faith community – to break the fast of Ramadan and think about Peace and Unity. As the society says, ‘These gatherings are more than just opportunities to break the fast – they’re where diverse voices meet, perspectives are shared, and friendships are forged. Our goal is to cultivate a stronger, more compassionate society through meaningful dialogue and open hearts.’ It was a wonderful event and I am pleased to have spoken to so many people about how we can work together as a community.



It was a reminder of how talking with openness and kindness is always the route to success: to peace and unity. WHAT IS GOD'S MESSAGE FOR ME THIS WEEK?

Gospel: John 3 : 14 – 21



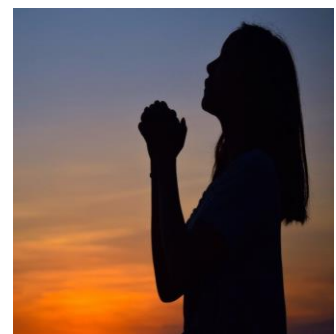
Jesus said to Nicodemus: “Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life.” For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God. And this is the verdict, that the light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and

does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.

Reflection

The coming of Jesus into the world leads to a choice: whoever chooses darkness will face a judgment of condemnation; whoever chooses light will have a judgment of salvation. The judgement is always the consequence of the free choice of each person. This is what we are called to do with greater dedication during Lent: to welcome the light into our conscience. Do not forget that God always forgives, always, if we humbly ask for forgiveness. It is enough just to ask for forgiveness, and he forgives.

*○ Lord, you who let your body to be taken, broken and given away for the life of the world, we pray that you would take our own broken bodies—broken by sickness, sorrow, shame, age or abuse—and bless them so that they might be instruments of blessing to our neighbours. In your name.

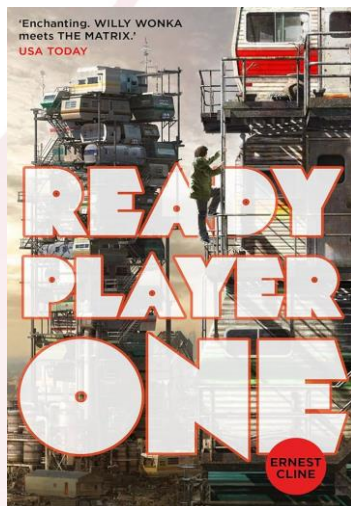

OxLAT Latin Teaching Scheme 2024—2026

The Faculty of Classics is again able to offer its Latin teaching scheme, OxLAT and is inviting our students to apply.


The OxLAT Scheme students in Years 8, 9 and 10 (13—15 year olds who will be going into Years 9, 10 and 11 in September 2024) who are interested in studying for a GCSE in Latin. The Scheme offers eligible students free tuition in Latin language and literature from scratch through to GCSE examination.

Weekly two-hour lessons take place every Saturday morning during school term-time at the Faculty of Classics (66 St Giles, Oxford) and are taught by two professional Latin instructors: they will start in June 2024 and continue for two years until the summer of 2026 when students will sit their Latin GCSE exams.

The academic programme of the scheme replicates the teaching students would experience if they were taking the subject as a GCSE option at school (albeit in a reduced timetable and with greater focus on independent learning): students will be expected to consolidate their classroom learning with appropriate study-time at home each week, aided by the Scheme's VLE system. Homework will be roughly the same as one would expect for any GCSE subject.

DO YOU WANT TO LEARN LATIN?

OXFORD LATIN TEACHING SCHEME 2024—2026

The Faculty Of Classics at the University of Oxford is offering state school pupils FREE Latin teaching to GCSE-level.

If you are interested in learning the language of the Romans, CARPE DIEM! and see overleaf for more details.

The OxLAT Scheme is for enthusiastic and committed students in Years 8, 9 and 10 (who will be going into Years 9, 10 and 11 in September 2024) who are interested in studying for a GCSE in Latin but attend state schools where there is no Latin provision. The Scheme offers eligible students free tuition in Latin language and literature from scratch through to GCSE examination.

Weekly two-hour lessons take place every Saturday morning during term-time at the Faculty of Classics (66 St Giles, Oxford) and are taught by two professional Latin instructors: they will start in September 2024 and continue for two years until the summer of 2026 when students will sit their Latin GCSE exams.

The academic programme of the scheme replicates the teaching students would experience if they were taking the subject as a GCSE option at school (albeit in a reduced timetable and with greater focus on independent learning): students will be expected to consolidate their classroom learning with appropriate study-time at home each week, aided by a VLE (virtual learning environment). Homework will be roughly the same as one would expect for any GCSE subject.

WHEN: June 2024 – May 2026. Lessons will take place every Saturday (10:30–13:00), during Oxfordshire schools' term-dates.

STRUCTURE: 2 years of intensive language and literature study in small groups. Students will be expected to sit a Latin GCSE at their school in May 2026.

COSTS: None. The Scheme is offered for free as part of the Faculty of Classics Outreach Programme.

ELIGIBILITY: Only current Year 8, 9 and 10 students at state schools that do not currently have any Latin provision (which includes lunch-time/after-school Latin clubs) are eligible. There is no strict catchment area for this scheme: if you live in Oxfordshire or the surrounding regions (and meet the other eligibility requirement above) you are eligible.
