Dear families

Our Gospel passage this week, the story of the Widow and the Two Coins, challenges us to reflect on humility, faithfulness, and true generosity. The widow, despite her poverty, gave all she had to live on — not out of obligation, but from a heart filled with trust and love. Her act reminds us that true giving is not measured by the amount, but by the spirit in which it is offered. It is about giving all that we are able, even when no one else sees or acknowledges it.

This story ties beautifully into our term theme of Solidarity. Like the widow, when we offer what we can to our community — our time, our efforts, our care — we strengthen the bonds between us. Solidarity calls us to see one another not through the lens of comparison, but as companions on a shared journey. When we work for and with each other, offering our best with humility, we build a community that is richer and stronger for everyone.

Our Year 7 Parents' Evening was a wonderful example of acknowledging what has been given to the school community. Not only by students, but also by their families and, of course, the staff in this school. The spirit in which time, care and love were offered show our community is one that bursts with pride and optimism. I was also grateful to our 6th Form helpers, who served refreshments to the community. It was a wonderful evening.



It was also wonderful to see Years 9 - 13 take part in **Future Fest** this week. This event, as detailed below, is an inspiring event for students to think about their futures. I am especially grateful to the volunteers and to Miss Jess Manns. There also now seems to be a tradition of one of the exhibitors being a former student of mine or the school — as pictured — this is now a challenge for every Future Fest!

WHAT IS GOD'S MESSAGE FOR ME THIS WEEK?

Gospel: Mark 12:38-44

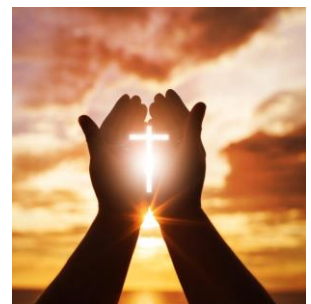


In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds, 'Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honour in synagogues, and places of honour at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation.' He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them, 'Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood.'

Reflection

The Gospel presents us with this striking contrast: the rich who give from their surplus wealth to make themselves seen, and a poor woman, who without seeming to, offers every little bit she has. Jesus praises the fact that this widow puts all she has into the treasury. She has nothing left, but finds her everything in God. She is not afraid of losing the little she has because she trusts in God's abundance, and God's abundance multiplies the joy of those who give. The sound of her few coins is more beautiful than the grandiose offerings of the rich, since they express a life sincerely dedicated to God, a faith that does not live by appearances but by unconditional trust. Let us learn from her.

Lord, help us be like this faithful woman who gave all she had to you. When we are tempted to show off our faith, or give only when it's convenient, help us to remember her example: that true richness comes from giving all that we have. Help us when that is hard. May we feel close to you when we commit to such a sacrifice. Amen.

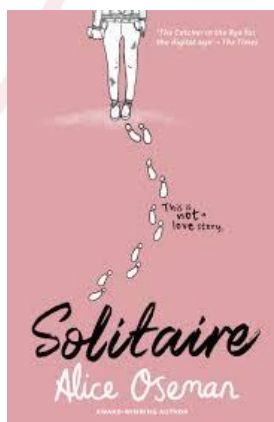

Free School Meals



Are you entitled?

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you get any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)

- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household earnings must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get).

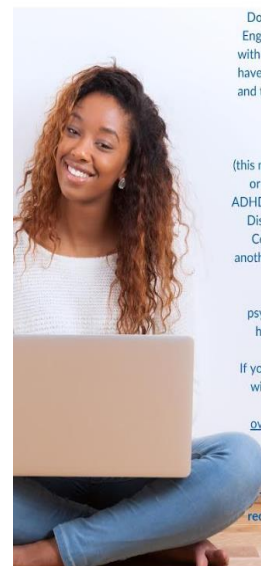
